Gaudete Sunday 'He came for testimony, to testify to the light .'Is 61:1-2, 10-11 Cant Lk 1:46-54; 1 Thess 5:16-24; Jn 1:6-8, 19-28. Msgr. Robert Draper

The theme of Spirit-given prophecy appears in all three readings today. Prophesying is not about foretelling the future; it is about speaking out God's word today. That is what is announced by Isaiah, that is what Paul tells the Thessalonians they are to do, and that is precisely what John the Baptist does in the gospel; he speaks out God's word to challenge those who question him. John's gospel is full of the language of a legal trial. Jesus is challenged by his opponents and responds with his defence and the testimony of his works and of those who witness to him. Here John is a witness, one who gives evidence on behalf of the accused. And of course, ultimately – and magnificently – Jesus is vindicated by his Resurrection, and with him all those who bear witness are vindicated. In the passage from Isaiah being anointed with the spirit of the Lord enables the prophet to proclaim Good News. Paul insists that the Thessalonians have been called by God and the spirit is to be embraced not suppressed. John announces that the Lord has come and is present in their midst. Like these, all Christians are called to be witnesses, to speak God's Word, to proclaim Good News, and all this is done in

the power of the spirit. That power has been given through the anointing received, and that power must not be suppressed but be embraced. 'Be happy at all times; pray constantly; and for all things give thanks to God because this is what God expects you to do in Christ Jesus' (I Thess 5: 16-17)

My dear friends, the third Sunday of Advent is a joyful Sunday, and the second reading is very comforting. It is consoling over the sufferings, the pains of hearts, the unbearable situations and mental distress we are passing through, and I believe God is speaking to you and I in a unique and personal way. Knowing about everything, he is looking directly into our eyes and simply saying through the Apostle Paul: 'be happy at all times' (I Thess 5: 16). He said it twice to demonstrate the importance of what is expected of us.

Being happy is in fact what we need at this difficult time. We cannot allow our burdens to take away our happiness and joy. We must be courageous and not succumb to our problems. And that is what Jesus is addressing when he invites us to be happy. He does not want us to allow our fears, anxieties and struggles to weigh us down. He wants us to accept them with courage and be hopeful that there is a light at the end of the tunnel, because he will always be there to lead us through the dark moments in our lives. He wants us to replace hatred with love; despair with hope; doubt with faith; sadness with joy; and never allow anything to take away the joy we feel because our Saviour, the Son of man is closer to us more than we can ever imagine or thought. His coming at the appointed time will end every suffering and we shall be at peace with him in its fullness. We should therefore not miss this opportunity of enjoying ourselves at this time.

Challenges will come and go but we will remain unconquered because they are for our sanctification, and before we know it the former challenges have passed on. We are healed in the wounds of Christ because he who is in you and I has redeemed us and is greater than the challenges and storms our life. He wants us to offer them in prayer and leave the rest for him. Hence, he says: 'come to me all you who labour and are overburdened, I will give you rest. Shoulder your yoke and learn from me for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls' (Mt 11: 28 -29). Always be assured that He who has called you will not allow you to fail for his love is all over you. Believe you me, he loves and cares for you and wants you to be happy irrespective of challenges. Put on a smiling face, move on and be happy. Enjoy the beautiful Christmas songs and know that Jesus loves you like no other. Take courage and be happy!

Handover of the Methodist Church 14th December 2023 Fr Joseph's Message:

"Thank you, Lin, for this baton representing the passing on of the Christian faith in this church, and I accept it with

150 years ago good citizens of what was then a much smaller Gillingham, had a vision to plant a place of worship at the heart of the town. As it says in Isaiah 40 "Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord". You will see on the outside of the building numbered bricks and stone plaques representing the donations of those visionaries. They were the giants of their day, and it is now on the shoulders of those giants that we are building.

I cannot let this moment pass without reflecting on the generosity of the members of your congregation as they go through a very difficult and painful change. Selling one's home is never easy, especially one that has been loved as much as this building. The support of Phil Butler, Dick Evans and Gordon Amery show the embodiment of love of God and love of neighbour despite the pain involved. So thank you, Lin, and thank you all for the support you have shown and we will endeavour to continue to make The Church flourish in the midst of our community."
