Second Sunday in Advent Reflection (Monsignor Robert Draper) 'Comfort, o comfort my people says your God .'Is 40:1-5, 9-11 Ps 84 2 Pt 3:8-14 Mk 1:1-8

John the Baptist has been designated as patron saint of motorways on the strength of today's readings. For Isaiah and for John it is important that there is nothing to stand in the way of the Lord's coming. No obstacle can get in the way, for the Lord's advent is certain. The declaration from Isaiah is majestic and exudes God's power, but it is not a rough power – the image of gathering lambs in his arms and holding them against his breast speaks of utmost tenderness. This is not a God who rides roughshod over his people. That is why John calls for repentance – he calls for the people to turn to God and receive the one who comes. For Christians the only obstacle that stands in the way of the Lord is the obstacle of sin and human resistance - that is why Peter calls on his readers to live lives that will mean they are at peace with the Lord lives that will welcome the one who comes. Much of the liturgy of Advent is focussed on the Lord's coming, but partly that is to help us carry out the preparation needed to receive the Lord.

(Advent Reflection Contd.) The Lord does indeed come in might, but also in love, that is why fear is not the most appropriate response to the challenge of the last days promised by the reading from Peter. As the gospel tells us John comes to prepare the way and he does that by calling on the people to change their ways – repentance is literally a call to think differently. The image that will fill our minds in two weeks will be that of the child in the manger – to hold on to these very different images: one of God coming in power, and the other of a baby in a manger, will require very 'different thinking'.

New Church Update

It is expected that the diocese will have bought the new church by 17th December 2023, when they will hand it



over to the parish. It will close for 6 months whilst renewal is carried out. We have appointed an architect and project manager and are rapidly moving from 'concept' to 'design'. Thanks to the work of many parishioners we have a clear idea of design for the church, narthex, hall, sacristy/vestry, parish office and priest's house. We plan to reopen in Summer 2024 with basic reordering of the church complete. A stone font and

altar, a beautiful sanctuary, a confessional and artwork will have been installed. As we develop ideas for 'better' and 'best' reordering we will publish a vision early next year, and how we may all contribute to delivery. The dedication of the church (and name) will be decided by the bishop in due course. We will hold an open day for parishioners to visit the building and to speak with the team on Saturday 6th January from 10.00am to Noon.

The Jesse tree at Our Lady's



"There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. And the spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him, and the spirit of wisdom and understanding" (Isaiah 11:1-2 (RSV)

Jesse Trees are a very

old Christmas Tradition which began in medieval times The first Jesse trees were large carvings, tapestries or occasionally stained glass windows placed in Churches to help people to learn about the Bible from creation to the Christmas Story. But now Jesse Trees are used as a kind of Advent Calendar. Fr Joseph invites you to write a prayer and hang it on the Jesse tree at Our Lady's.



In the Catholic Church, the concept of Jubilee or 'Holy Year' was used to declare special years for forgiveness and reconciliation. The first Jubilee was declared by Pope Boniface VIII on 22nd February 1300 (Feast of the Chair of St. Peter), to mark the beginning of that century. More recently a Great Jubilee was declared in 2000 by Pope Saint John Paul II to celebrate the new millennium. That Jubilee year brought the total number of universal Jubilee years to 28 that so far had been celebrated by the Church. The 2025 Jubilee, which has the theme of "Pilgrims of Hope" will be a year of hope and trust for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and the increased threats to the climate.

Intended as a time of conversion and emphasis on God's mercy and forgiveness of sins, Jubilees begin with the opening of the Holy Door in St. Peter's Basilica. Holy Doors at each of the four papal basilicas in Rome are destination points for pilgrims, who pass through seeking special graces. The Holy Father has asked us to focus on two things: the **Our Father**, and the four **Constitutions of the Second Vatican Council**. The Our Father as a means to focus our prayer, and the Constitutions as a means to renew the catechesis in the Church.
