On Friday 18<sup>th</sup> March, Tricia and Ros from Marnhull Green TEAMS came to school to deliver their very kind donation of books for our school library. These books are to support our learning about looking after the environment. The children really impressed them with their understanding of ways in which we can look after God's wonderful world.

We have a new climbing wall! The School Council decided on our new addition to the playground, replacing the old one. The children were very eager to try it out! It was so lovely to see the older children helping

the younger ones along the wall, so that they too could enjoy traversing along the routes. We have some new additions to our St Mary's family – 5 new chicks! Miss Gould has been looking after our eggs for 21 days now so it was thrilling to see them hatch! It's all been very 'eggsiting' watching the eggs start to wobble, hearing faint chirps, then a little crack, followed by a tiny beak poking through and finally freedom as the shell comes away from the tired little chick. Very soon after, the chicks are up and some are still a bit wobbly, but the transformation a day later into little bundles of fluff. The children have all been keen to



visit the eggs/chicks to see the progress made. These eggs were from the chicks we hatched last year, so it's great to see how the generations are thriving. It's now up to each class decide on a name for each of the chicks.

You may be aware that Father Ralph Candy, who grew up in this very parish, is appointed by Bishop Mark to be the Vocations Director for the Diocese of Plymouth. In that capacity, he has written to all parishes asking that we keep at the forefront of our minds and hearts the ongoing need for men to respond to the call of Jesus Christ to 'leave all things and follow' him in the ministry of Sacramental Priesthood. Fr. Ralph asks for our help with his work in the following ways:

**PRAY** for vocations; perhaps we could say a prayer for vocations at the end of each Sunday Mass? **INVITE** – be ready to plant the thought in the head of a young, or somewhat older, man that God may want to bless him with the beautiful, inspiring, grace filled, fascinating, enjoyable life which is the blessing enjoyed by Catholic Priests. **CELEBRATE** – express love, support and gratitude for our priests and their dedication to their ministry. I know from experience that this happens constantly on a personal level in this parish; we could bring it to each other's attention by planning a special way of marking it on Good Shepherd Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Easter (this year it falls on 8<sup>th</sup> May) Fr. Ralph also suggests we think of attending ordinations when they occur in the diocese. These are beautiful occasions and our attendance will enhance the experience for all priests – and future priests – who are there.
