Worshippers at Our Lady's will have noticed the signs giving advance warning of road closures near the church from 18<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> December. Fr. Francis has been in touch with Dorset County Council to obtain more details: Throughout the closure period there will be no access from the B3092 into Great Down Lane. Those normally coming to church that way will have to go via Sodom Lane, Pilwell and Nash Lane. There will be a second road closure down Old Mill Lane from the junction with Great Down Lane. The Council and the contractors have indicated that they will clear a route through the works when access to the church is needed, but you may have to wait a little while for them to provide a safe way through. In this way it should be possible to have all our usual Masses, but this will be confirmed in the next newsletter.

Please pass this link on to *anyone* you think may be willing to do the survey. Remember, as well as valuing the views of practicing Catholics, the Church wants to listen to everyone.

We are fast approaching the 17<sup>th</sup> December, which is a significant date in Advent: one week later is Christmas Eve, so the liturgy gives voice to our increased excitement at the Coming of our Saviour into the world. The special Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer at Mass says: "It is by his (Jesus')"

gift that we already rejoice at the mystery of his Nativity, so that he may find us watchful in prayer and exultant in his praise." Those who say the Divine Office will notice the special Antiphons for the Magnificat at Evening Prayer. They are called the Great O Antiphons, because they each address our Saviour with a different title of God:

O Wisdom (O Sapientia), O Lord of lords (O Adonai), O Stock of Jesse (O Radix Jesse), O Key of David (O Clavis David), O Rising Sun (O Oriens), O King of Nations (O Rex Gentium), O God-With-Us (O Emmanuel).

You may recognize the titles, as they are the first lines of the verses of the hymn, O Come, O Come, Emmanuel.

At the time the antiphons were composed, before the sixth century, people had a great interest in word patterns. They gave their compositions greater depth of meaning by arranging the words in ways which gave cryptic messages to the reader who could decipher them. There is just such a message contained in the O Antiphons:

If you take the first letter of each Latin title you get S-A-R-C-O-R-E

If you reverse the order, so you're in effect reading them by looking back from the day before Christmas Eve, you get E-R-O-C-R-A-S. The Latin words Ero Cras translate into English as "Tomorrow I will be with you"

To the right is a detail of the manuscript illuminated by a monk of Buckfast Abbey which the Abbot uses to sing the antiphon "O Emmanuel" on 23<sup>rd</sup> December.

News from our parish school

It was a great pleasure to celebrate Mass on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Our Lady with the school and parish together in Our Lady's. We began with the lovely hymn, "As I Kneel Before You." The children sang beautifully as Deacon James and Father Francis processed in and incensed the altar with Mr. Wardley and Sophie and Madalena as altar servers. The scriptures told how Adam and Eve disobeyed God. Eventually, God wanted to send his Son to save everyone from the effects of this disobedience. Father explained that, because God knew that Mary would say yes to be the Mother of God, he gave her a special gift at the moment she was created: he prevented that bad seed of pride from entering her, so she was completely pure and beautiful. That's what it means when we say Mary is the Immaculate Conception. After Holy Communion, we sang a version of the Hail Mary to reflect on God's gift of grace to Mary and her courage and faith in agreeing to do what God asked.

Then Father gave some special letters to our senior pupils who have agreed to be Pupil Chaplains and help the children to know Jesus. The letters were from the Bishop himself. He thanked the Chaplains for doing this for God and commissioned them to do all they can to share the Good News of Jesus.

The celebration was rounded off beautifully with the lovely children's voices singing "The Angel Gabriel From Heaven Came."

Thank you to all the parishioners who shared this time with us, and thank you especially to Mr. Bowe who kindly played the organ.
