New Tercentenary Celebration Event 2025

Most of the Reformation-imposed restrictions on Catholic practice in Britain were only lifted by The Roman Catholic Relief Acts of 1791 and 1829. Yet in 1725, a Catholic mission was established at Marnhull, a point of historical importance for religious tolerance, and placing Marnhull firmly on the national Catholic map.

This summer, our Parish will celebrate this Tercentenary across a two-week period in early July. There will be an associated spiritual programme at Our Lady's Church, but local walks with a relevant historical focus, an exhibition of historical records, a planting event at St Mary's School and a summer flower festival, together with displays of art and drawing by the school children and a local radio podcast to capture the history provides a focus for everyone.

In terms of the main event, on Saturday 05 July at 11am, an open-air Parish Mass to acknowledge the humble mission beginnings will be celebrated under a tented canopy on the school field, and there will be a Parish Tea Party in the same place on Sunday 6th July in the afternoon.

Marian Month of May Pope Francis: "I invite you to pray the rosary, and to carry it in your hands or in your pockets. The recitation of the rosary is the most beautiful prayer we can offer to the Virgin Mary; it is a contemplation on the stages of the life other Mary and is a weapon

of Jesus the Saviour with his Mother Mary and is a weapon that protects us from evils and temptations". The Church dedicates the month of May to the Blessed Mary Virgin. In honour of this we will be saying all four mysteries of the Holy Rosary, every Friday (20 decades) from 5pm at St Benedict's Church in Gillingham. Our Lady of Fatima first appeared to the three children on 13th May 1917 and exhorted them to pray the rosary for world peace. St John Paul said: "To pray the Rosary is to hand over our burdens to the merciful hearts of Christ and His mother."
