Bishop Mark asks our prayers for Fr. Barry Hallett, Parish Priest of Dorchester, who suffered a heart attack a few days ago and is now recovering at home. He also gives this advice regarding support for the people in Ukraine: "We have all been touched by people's generosity in wanting to respond to the situation in Ukraine. To make sure we reach those most in need, we have been advised

that generosity is best expressed through donations of money rather than goods. Caritas agencies in Ukraine and neighbouring counties have all confirmed financial support is the most helpful form of donation. Simon Giarchi, CAFOD Coordinator for Plymouth Diocese, writes:

"The Catholic community here has been amazing in its outpouring of love and support for the people of Ukraine. It is helping in bomb shelters and cities under attack and across Ukraine, where CAFOD's brilliant Caritas and Church partners are working tirelessly, providing beds, food, washing facilities and transport to people trying to survive. In fact since the beginning of the war Caritas Ukraine has assisted no less than 318,252 beneficiaries, and Caritas SpesUkraine has helped 215,470 people! In neighbouring countries the work continues, for example in Poland we are helping to support our Caritas sister agency to run around 1,000 centres specialising in social assistance and medical care alongside 100,000 Caritas volunteers who provide support in these centres on a daily basis. - These statistics are remarkable and a powerful witness to the Catholic community's love and faith in action."

The Caritas Center in Mariupol has been attacked. At least seven people died, including two women staff members.

According to local Caritas sources, on March 15 a Russian tank fired shots at the Caritas center in Mariupol, killing the two employees and five of their family members who had taken refuge in the building. The tragic news only emerged yesterday. "We need your solidarity and prayers for the families of the victims", said the president of Caritas Ukraine, Tetiana Stawnychy. In an interview with Vatican Media Cardinal Luis Antonio Tagle, president of Caritas Internationalis, emphasizes the value of the testimony of those who, at the risk of their own lives, are helping the Ukrainian people devastated by the war and makes a heartfelt appeal for an end to this conflict.

The Second Sunday of Easter. is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. Divine Mercy Sunday is also the day after the culmination of the novena of the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. At 3.00 pm on Sunday afternoon at St Benedict's Church, there will be an opportunity to pray the Chaplet and venerate the image Divine Mercy. Even if you haven't completed the Novena, come along for a time of prayer and reflection on the mercy of God.
