A Reflection on the readings for the second Sunday of Lent by Monsignor Robert Draper

Today's first reading is part of the series of Genesis readings regarding the Covenant with Abraham. There is a real poignancy in the repeated phrase: "Your son, your only son, whom you love." While the suggestion that God asks Abraham to sacrifice his beloved son will raise distress in many people that will only reinforce what has been the Church's understanding of this as a prefiguring of the sacrifice of Jesus "My beloved Son." In the detail that Isaac carries the wood on his back and climbs the hill as a sacrifice we have an echo of Jesus carrying his own cross (in the synoptic tradition) up to Calvary to be the sacrifice for the sins of the world. It is not accidental that we will hear this Genesis reading again at the Easter Vigil. In the last paragraph of today's passage Abraham's descendants are mentioned three times in blessing; all those who gather for the celebrations of the Eucharist can acknowledge themselves to be numbered among those blessed descendants – "Abraham, our father in faith" (Eucharistic Prayer 1).

The gospel for the second Sunday of Lent is always that of the Transfiguration. In the words of today's preface the purpose of the Transfiguration of Jesus during his ministry was: 'to show (the disciples) . . . that the passion leads to the glory of the resurrection.' This gospel is placed here during Lent to remind Christians engaged in the spiritual journey of Lent that what they are preparing for is the splendour of the celebration of the Risen Lord which is Easter.
