

### Open Church event. St. Benedict's last Sunday

Our prayers were answered for the Open Church event at St Benedict's.

A total of twelve parishioners turned out for Adoration, then a brief input from Deacon James and Tony Moore on what to do and how to do it.

At 3pm the rain stopped (the time planned to get outside the church) and we took it in turns in pairs to invite passers-by to come into the church. Whilst no-one was actually counting, an estimate for that hour we were outside inviting, a total of about 9 or 10 people accepted our invitation, came in and chatted with our



volunteers about the church itself, about faith, and we all learned to listen better! Some lit candles too.

We stopped at 4.pm as planned, just as the rain resumed!

Our emphasis was on prayer, with the prayer to the Holy Spirit "Lord, bring me someone today to share you with" being our daily prayer.

Our Parish Evangelisation group meet after Thursday morning Mass at Our Lady's and everyone is welcome: next meeting will be this Thursday (19th January). We begin with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

Next Saturday morning (21st January) after Mass at Our Lady's, we will hear from our Diocesan Outreach worker, Michele Thompson, who will travel from Plymouth to talk to us about "How to Listen". Michele is an excellent speaker, who is passionate about her work. Please come and bring a friend.

# OUR LADY'S MARNHULL AND ST BENEDICT'S GILLINGHAM

Since 1998, the Bishops' Conference's Department for International Affairs has organised the annual meeting of the Coordination of Episcopal Conferences in Support of the Church of the Holy Land. The Holy Land Co-ordination focuses on the three 'P's: Prayer, Pilgrimage and Persuasion. Prayer is the framework of the annual meeting, with daily celebration of the Eucharist, often in different rites. Pilgrimage to the local Catholic communities is always a key part of the visit. The 'Persuasion' component usually occurs when the delegates return to their home countries and share their views with parliamentarians, diplomats and the media on a wide range of issues affecting the lives of Christians in the Holy Land.

This year, Bishops from 11 countries gathered on 14<sup>th</sup> January in Jordan to meet with the Christian community. There are more than 200,000 Christians in the country. Its Catholic parishes, schools and social projects form an important part of the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem. As well as visiting parishioners and young people throughout Jordan, the Bishops will be

meeting Christian refugees from Iraq and Syria who have sought sanctuary in the country over recent years. the Bishops will be celebrating Mass at the site of the Baptism of the Lord and exploring how pilgrimages from their own countries can best continue to support the local Christian communities.

A LOUDfence is a visible display of support and solidarity with those who have been affected by abuse. Attendees are encouraged to tie ribbons around a fence which could also include a message of support. We want survivors to know that we hear you, we believe you and that we are here to support you. Have you noticed the big orange box by the door of the Chapel Room in Our Lady's? It is there to collect household items which the Plymouth Diocese Catholic Children's Society can raise money from. Vicki Dunstone, Communications Officer, has written: "Since 2011, we have raised over £18,000 averaging around £1,500 over the last three years. But 2022 has broken all previous annual totals as

£3,542.63 has been raised thanks to the kindness of many of our parishes and schools, some of whom have only recently started collecting using our Orange Box recycling scheme.

Items that can be collected in the Orange Boxes include: Stamps, Coins & Banknotes, Medals, Gold, Silver & Precious metals, SMALL household metal items (Including cutlery and old kitchen utensils), ornaments and watches (working or not) and Catholic memorabilia such as rosaries, crucifixes, pendants etc.

As Spring approaches (*hope springs eternal*!) and we feel the urge to Spring clean, don't forget this handy way of de-cluttering and supporting children at the same time.
