Last Wednesday, Pope Francis appointed Bishop Mark to be the Archbishop of Cardiff. He will be installed on 20th June. Soon after, the Canons will elect an Administrator who will lead the diocese until the Holy Father appoints a new Bishop of Plymouth.

This certainly does not mean everything must come to a halt. The Gospel of Salvation must continue to be proclaimed and the life and mission of the Church in the Diocese of Plymouth carried forward, albeit in anticipation of the gift of a new successor to the Apostles to lead us and, through whose communion with the Bishop of Rome, our diocese is fully united with the Catholic Church throughout the world.

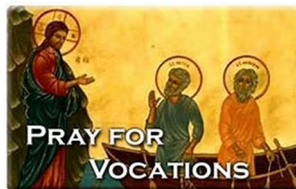
During this time of transition, our primary task as a diocese and in our parishes will be to unite together in earnest prayer that:

Reflection by Deborah Fisher, Plymouth Diocese Caritas Manager

'Fratelli Tutti' the Path to a Better Future

The journey from Easter to Pentecost is perhaps an opportune moment to contemplate, look and listen to all that is happening in the world, and reflect on what we can do to create a better future for humanity and the planet we call home, despite the very challenging times we are living in.

I recommend reading (or re-reading) 'Fratelli Tutti' with its wide-ranging reflections on migration, conflict, politics, the environment and religions. There are so many words of wisdom but throughout the document Pope Francis focuses on the need for a 'love ever more open', where social friendship and universal fraternity are guiding principles and where we promote 'the good, for ourselves and for the whole human family, and thus advance together towards an authentic and integral growth' (FT #113).

'Jesus asks us to be present to those in need of help, regardless of whether or not they belong to our social group.' (FT #81). At Caritas Plymouth we want to ensure that this does not remain an abstract idea but that we find concrete ways to act - be it responding to those fleeing grave humanitarian crises as we are currently seeing in Ukraine; seeking forms of social friendship that include everyone; reaching out to help those less advantaged. One way to do this is to take up Pope Francis' challenge and cultivate kindness in our everyday interactions with others. Saint Paul describes kindness as a fruit of the Holy Spirit (Gal 5:22). If we make a daily effort to be kind, we can all make the a positive difference.
