# Free Online Learning for KS2

We work in partnership with <u>Atom Learning</u>, the leading online Key Stage 2 learning platform, to provide children in Years 3-6 who are eligible for

#### **Music Tuition**

For Key Stage 2 children who have arranged for music lessons with Mr Gassman – lessons will start at 9:00 on 16<sup>th</sup> September. If your child is in Year 3-6, he is offering:

BRASS -Trumpet/Cornet, Trombone & Tenor Horn

WOODWIND - Flute, Clarinet & Alto Sax (Yr4 to 6 only for sax - weight)

20 mins - £10

30 mins - £15

Groups 2-4 = 30 mins (cost divided)

Instrument hire is normally £60 per year. but because Y5 and Y6 have done Musicianship Programme (Samba) in the last 12 months of completion they can get it for free for the first year. Mrs Gassman deals with the instruments at the warehouse as well.

For Y3 and Y4 pupils who would be interested, it's £30 for first year and then £60 per year for the main instruments. Please let your class teacher know if your child would like to take up music instrument lessons next year so we can arrange this with Mr Gassman.


#### Car park
