Parish Rosary In 16th century, at the request of Pope Pius V, the Christian world prayed the rosary to save it from invasion by the Turks. The deciding battle of Lepanto, fought at sea in October 1571, was won by the Christian fleet. Since that time, October has been a month dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary (feast 7th October).

Our present world is being invaded and eroded day by day, by secularism, humanism and egoism. The most immediate threat is the multi-pronged attack on the sanctity of life. It is time to turn again to our Blessed Lady in the Rosary to intercede for us on the issues of the sanctity of life: the horrors of abortion, and the attempt by a vociferous few to legalise assisted suicide.

Therefore in our parish we will commit to pray the rosary from many angles: in our two churches in October on Friday evenings at 6.00pm; On Zoom online at 6.00pm each October Friday, led by Deacon Michael, (technical help may be available); for those without other means, a pledge to pray the Rosary at 6pm on October Fridays, from wherever you may be at the time.

We are also arranging to pray an open air Rosary in Sturminster Newton during this month.
