 During Lent, we meet in the Methodist Church on Fridays at noon for a reflection, sometimes* followed by a Lent lunch:



I was delighted last Monday to celebrate Holy Mass in Guy's Marsh Prison. It was even more special because it was the first Mass celebrated in the prison for about two years: while chaplaincy was maintained throughout, HM Prison Service found it necessary to stop religious services in prisons during the pandemic. The celebration was tinged with great sadness, because that very morning, an inmate had died. It was consoling that the Mass provided the opportunity to pray for the repose of his soul and for his bereaved family and friends. The man was 29 years old and nearing the end of his sentence. He was suffering serious mental ill-health.

PACT (Prisoners' Advice and Care Trust) is a UK Catholic charity which champions the care and resettlement of prisoners and gives assistance to their families. CEO Andy Keen-Downs wrote recently, "We continue to see so many people in prison...who have offended because of mental ill health, or trauma, from which they seek escape through alcohol or drugs. And so, we (PACT) continue to make the case for more and better services for people in the community, and especially for those experiencing mental ill health, to be treated by properly funded NHS services rather than being sent to prison, where so many deteriorate and die."

As you know, Deacon Mike has worked as a chaplain at HMP Guy's Marsh for many years. He is due to leave that role this month, much to the regret of the inmates, staff and his fellow chaplains. Thank you, Mike, for your dedication to this important work, fulfilling in our midst the command of the Lord to visit those in prison. 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'
