

Next Sunday, 16th January is designated by the Bishops as Peace Sunday. Here is an extract from Pope Francis' message for the 55th World Day of Peace:

"In every age, peace is both a gift from on high and the fruit of a shared commitment. All can work together to build a more peaceful world, starting from the hearts of individuals and relationships in the family, then within society and with the environment, and all the way up to relationships between peoples and nations. Here I wish to propose three paths for building a lasting peace. First, dialogue between generations as the basis for the realization of shared projects. Second, education as a factor of freedom, responsibility and development. Finally, labour as a means for the full realization of human dignity."

Let's spend a little time praying for peace and thinking of ways to promote peace, following the advice of the Holy Father.
