The Bishops of England and Wales have updated their guidance on church services and other activities in the light of the relaxation of covid measures announced this week by the government. Parish priests are asked to update the parish policy in the light of this guidance and the circumstances of the parish. So, in this parish, the following changes to the current arrangements take effect from now on:

- Whether to wear a face covering is a matter of personal choice.
- There is no need for social distancing
- Congregational singing resumes and hymn books may be used
- The Sign of Peace may be offered, but please be understanding if others prefer to refrain from physical contact.
- Parish meetings and social activities can resume. This includes refreshments after the 9.30 a.m. Mass at Our Lady's on Sundays
- Ventilation should be moderated by the importance of heating the church at this time of the year.

Measures which are unchanged are:

- Holy Communion is distributed as the Sacred Host only
- You are encouraged to use hand sanitiser on entry to the church

"What is God saying to the Church?" *Fr. Jon Bielawski writes:*

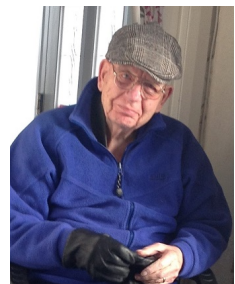
This is an on-line event Tuesday 1st March at 6 p.m. It is promoted by Fr. James Mallon and Divine Renovation. With the link provided here:

The children in St. Anthony's class have really impressed us with their independent learning, in particular their writing. In English, after reading the story 'The Train Ride', the children collected interesting nouns and adjectives related to what they may see on a train journey. It was great fun exploring language together from the 'tall, towering buildings' to the 'soft, fluffy sheep'.

The children are continuing to enjoy the mastery approach to maths, growing in confidence using lots of practical resources. We are looking forward to delving deeper into our 'Trains' topic: in history we will be investigating trains through time; in science we will be discovering how steam was used to power trains and in DT we will be making moving train pictures.
